

Dear Parent/Carers.

We are nearing the end of what has been an incredibly challenging academic year and I wanted to take this opportunity to thank you all for your support throughout this time.

As your new Principal, it has been wonderful to hear how the Halewood community has pulled together and supported each other. We now, more than ever, realise the importance of schools in our young people's lives. Halewood staff have been working relentlessly to ensure that they are supporting our students and their families both inside and outside of the classroom and I would like to both acknowledge this immense effort and thank them for their selfless approach. A special mention should be given to Ms Gallagher, whose exceptional leadership as interim Principal has maintained high standards and consistency throughout.

We are very much looking forward to our next, less complicated, academic year (2021-22). With the government announcement last week, school should start to feel more normal and I am sure we will all welcome this. The announcement to end the 'bubble' system means that students will be able to access subject specific teaching spaces again. The number of students who are self-isolating will also reduce with the recommendation that only those who test positive isolate.

There is an expectation that students should be given an opportunity to complete lateral flow tests prior to their return. We do recommend this, however, it is optional and will only be carried out with your consent. As a result, the return date for students is as follows:

In preparation for your child's return, please can I ask that you support the school by ensuring that the following expectations are met:

Uniform

We would like to draw your attention to the following, examples of each can be found using the above link:

- **School bags** must be black, have two straps and be big enough to fit an A4 folder, books and a PE kit. Handbags are not permitted.
- **School shoes** must be leather, black and with a plain design. Trainers, pumps or shoes with bows are not permitted.
- **Jewellery-** students may wear a wrist watch. They may also wear a symbol of faith, which should be hidden. All other jewellery including piercings (ears and facial); bracelets; rings; and non-faith-based necklaces are not permitted.
- Hair, nails and make-up- students should ensure that hair styles are not extreme
 and any colour change should appear natural. Make-up; false eyelashes; false nails
 or nail varnish are not permitted.

If students arrive with incorrect uniform, they will be provided with the correct uniform so that they are able to access their regular lessons.

Attendance and Punctuality

We would ask that all parents and carers support the school with ensuring excellent attendance and punctuality throughout the year.

There is a very strong link between school attendance, punctuality and academic achievement. Research shows that less than 95% attendance every school year equals one grade difference across all GCSE's. Therefore, we have a minimum attendance target of 96% for every pupil.

All year groups are expected to arrive before **8:45am**.
