


#### Dear parents and carers



In the previous academic year, we started using Class Charts at Halewood Academy. This is an online system which teachers use to track achievement and behaviour throughout the school day. We believe in working closely with parents and one of the key benefits of using Class Charts is that we are able to securely share your child(s) achievement and behaviour report with you and so keep you up to date in real-time.

We will be using this as our main method of communication with parents, replacing messages sent by Schoolcomms and most letters that would usually be posted.
