Introduction

This policy statement sets out Halewood Academy's arrangements for managing the access of providers to pupils at the school for the purpose of giving them information about the provider's education or training offer. This complies with the school's legal obligations under Section 42B of the Education Act 1997.

Pupil entitlement

All pupils in years 8-13 are entitled:

- To find out about technical education qualifications and apprenticeships opportunities, as part of a careers programme which provides information on the full range of education and training options available at each transition point.
- To hear from a range of local providers about the opportunities they offer, including technical education and apprenticeships through options events, assemblies and group discussions and taster events.
- To understand how to make applications for the full range of academic and technical courses.

Halewood Academy also provides this for Year 7 pupils.

A number of events, integrated into the school careers programme, will offer providers an <u>opportunity to come</u> into school to speak to pupils and/or their parents/carers:

Granting Access

Any providers who request access will be invited to our Careers Fairs and parent's evenings. We will aim to grant access via assemblies however this will be subject to factors such as dates and events already planned on our school calendar. Any access is granted subject to acceptance by the provider of Halewood Academy's safeguarding and equal opportunities policies. For examples, a copy of a DBS certificate may be required on arrival.

Premises and facilities

For events in school, Halewood Academy will make a suitable room available for discussions between the provider and the pupils as appropriate to the activity. The school will also make available AV and other specialist equipment to support provider presentations. This will all be discussed and agreed in advance of the visit with the Careers Coordinator.

Providers are welcome to leave a copy of their prospectus or other relevant course literature in the Careers Room. The Careers Room is available to all students at lunch and break times
