# **DEAR PARENTS AND CARERS**

### Changes to the School Day

You will remember that I wrote to you in March, seeking your views on proposed changes to the school day. The consultation period has now ended and I wanted to provide you with a summary of the responses and the plans for September 2023.

A very small number of responses were received, less than 3% of the school population. Some of these responses were fully supportive of the changes, whilst the remainder highlighted a small number of concerns, which I have addressed below. I would like to thank everybody who took the time to respond to the consultation, each one has been considered carefully.

Concern	Response
The change in the start and end time of the school day will impact on current drop off/ pick up routines.	By raising the proposed changes early, we hope this would allow ample time to make any necessary amendments to current routines. The school will continue to open from 8am until 4pm each day, to enable pupils to be on site before and after classes. A range of extra-curricular activities, homework clubs and revision will continue to be offered free of charge. We would encourage families to use these opportunities to add flexibility to their daily routines.
How will all year groups be served in a 45 minute lunch break?	The school's catering is provided by Knowsley Metropolitan Borough Council (KMBC). KMBC are responsible for the catering of all Knowsley secondary schools and already deliver a single breaktime and lunchtime to similar sized schools in the borough, within 45 minutes. KMBC currently operates six food service outlets at lunchtime, this will increase to 10. New food service outlets will be located in the atrium, the assembly hall and on the first floor. Additional dining tables and chairs for 300 pupils will be situated in the atrium and the assembly hall. We will also continue to promote the 'pre-order' service which enables pupils to order a range of sandwiches and salads each morning, freshly made for collection at lunchtime. <b>Please note that no dining or food service will take place in the Sports Hall, as some</b> <b>responses suggested may be the case.</b>



# DUKE OF EDINBURGH (DofE) EXPEDITION

#### What is the DofE?

A life-changing experience. A fun time with friends. An opportunity to discover new interests and talents. A tool to develop essential skills for life and work. A recognised mark of achievement; respected by employers.

The DofE is many things to many people, supporting generations to successfully navigate adult life.

14-24 year-olds can do a DofE programme at one of three progressive levels which, when successfully completed, leads to a **Bronze**, **Silver or Gold Duke of Edinburgh's Award**.

There are four sections to complete at **Bronze and Silver** level and five at **Gold**.

They involve helping the community/environment, becoming fitter, developing new skills, planning, training for and completing an expedition and, for Gold only, working with a team on a residential activity.

Halewood Academy are planning a expedition trip between May and June in Lancashire.

Saturday 17th - Sunday 18th June Expedition




Halewood Academy are in partnership with Shakespeare North Playhouse in Prescot.


Come along, bring your friends, and get the knowledge on MCing, Diing, Beatbasing, Breaking and Grafter.
