Students will know:

- how to recognise and use regular and regular verbs in a range of different time frames (present/past/imperfect/ near future/ conditional)
- how to recognise and use the future tense
- how to use present participles
- how to use interrogative adjectives (¿qué?, ¿cuál?, ¿cuáles?...)

Students will be able to:

- Respond appropriately to spoken language including some more extended passages, identifying overall messages, key points, details and opinions
- Develop conversations manipulating language with reasonable accuracy, expressing opinions and responding appropriately to unpredictable questions
- Use generally accurate pronunciation and intonation
- Respond appropriately to written language including some more extended texts, identifying overall messages, key points, details and opinions.
- Write clearly for different purposes, expressing ideas and opinions and manipulating vocabulary and grammar with reasonable accuracy.
- Use a wide range of opinion expressions and use more adventurous language to give positive and negative reasons for opinions

Students will know:

- how to recognise and use the pluperfect tenses
- how to recognise and use the subjunctive mood
- Which expressions trigger the subjunctive mood
- how to recognise the present passive voice
- how to use indefinite adjectives (cada, algunos, algunas)
- How to use possessive pronouns (el mío, la mía...)

Students will be able to:

- Respond effectively to spoken language including more complex and extended passages, extracting information, identifying opinions and drawing conclusions
- Initiate and sustain detailed conversations manipulating language mostly accurately, expressing ideas and justifying opinions and responding effectively to unpredictable questions
- Use mostly accurate pronunciation and intonation
- Respond effectively to written language including more complex texts, identifying opinions and inferring meaning
- Write effectively for different purposes explaining ideas, expressing and justifying opinions and manipulating vocabulary and grammar, including more complex language, mostly accurately.
