How will you keep me safe?

- We will educate you to ensure a strong culture of diversity and inclusivity where difference is celebrated positively;
- We will educate you to stay safe online and out in the community;
- All **Halewood Academy** staff are trained to spot the signs of abuse or neglect;
- Staff are trained to deal with incidents of abuse from adults to children and also abuse which can occur between young people;
- We will always listen and act upon your concerns. This may involve working with your parents or carers or getting help from other services outside of school;
- Your wishes and feelings will always be considered.

Why is it important?

From time to time, children can suffer abuse from adults and also young people. Abuse can be physically, sexually or emotionally harmful or neglectful and can happen in person or online, at home, within the community or in school.

We want to make sure that everyone at **Halewood Academy** is protected from abuse and harm.

Please also note the following;

Hoodies are not acceptable on the school premises.

Hair - A pupil's haircut is a very important part of their overall presentation. The Academy will not accept extreme haircuts. Pupils are not allowed to have extreme hair colours; colour change should appear natural. The Academy reserves the right to internally exclude pupils with an extreme hairstyle. Shoulder length hair should be tied back for all practical lessons. Hair bands should be plain in their appearance. Hair accessories must be only plain white, navy blue or black in colour.

Make up - Make up, false eyelashes and nail varnish are not permitted. Pupils who wear make-up, false eyelashes and nail varnish will be asked to remove it. Pupils failing to do so when asked will face appropriate sanctions.

Jewellery - Pupils may wear a wristwatch. They may also wear a cross or other symbol of faith for religious reasons but it may not be visible. Pupils with medical conditions can wear an identity tag. No badges are to be worn other than those issued by the Academy and one charity badge. Any inappropriate jewellery will be confiscated and placed in the Academy's safe. The Academy cannot accept responsibility for the safe keeping of jewellery. All jewellery must be removed for Physical Education.

Piercings - Pupils are not permitted to wear any form of facial or body piercing (including ears). Pupils who persistently violate these rules will be internally excluded. Earrings and other piercings covered by plasters are also not acceptable.

No mobile phones - Pupils are not allowed mobile phones during the school day from 8.00am to 3.00pm. Students need to leave their mobile phones switched off in their bag. Mobile phones will be confiscated.

No energy or fizzy drinks - Pupils are not allowed energy drinks. They may seem like an easy solution for boosting energy, but their potential negative effects on health, behaviour, and academic performance make them unsuitable for the school environment.

PE KIT

Students will need a school PE T-Shirt with **Halewood Academy** badge. There is a long sleeved over top which is recommended but not compulsory. Students are required to wear either plain black shorts, tracksuit bottoms or leggings. Parents do not have to purchase all of the items below. Students are expected to bring appropriate footwear to all PE lessons to enable them to engage fully with learning. Students require a clean pair of trainers suitable for indoor and outdoor lessons.

At times during the year, students will undertake PE outside. If students have studded boots suitable for use on grass or our 3G surface, then these are encouraged for outdoor PE lessons as an alternative to trainers.

Students have the option to wear base layers underneath their PE kit, particularly during cold weather. We request that students choose black garments that complement our school uniform.



- Halewood T-shirt (compulsory)
- Quarter zip Halewood jumper (optional)
- Halewood Swacket (optional)
- Plain black shorts, tracksuit bottoms or leggings (compulsory and purchased from any location preferable to families)
- Trainers (purchased from any location)
- Football boots (purchased from any location) can be used when pupils are studying their football unit of work. Shin pads are also recommended for pupils to use within football and hockey lessons, and are optional to bring to lessons from home.



Our expectation is that kit is brought to every lesson even if pupils are ill or injured. PE staff will adapt the lesson to suit the pupils needs. Only major illnesses/injuries will result in no participation and will need a doctors note.

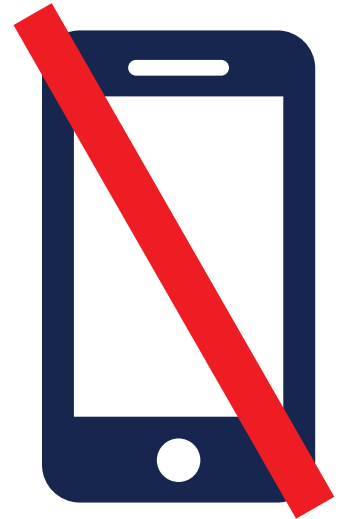
OUR MOBILE PHONE POLICY

Our mobile phone policy is very clear and has not changed. Phones should not be heard, used or visible between **8.00am** and **3.00pm**.

If it is heard, used or visible, the member of staff will confiscate the phone and this can be collected at the end of the day. Refusal to comply with a reasonable request may well result in suspension from school.

As per our policy, if a pupil has their phone confiscated on more than one occasion in a term; students will not be given the item(s) back until collected by a parent/carer. This will not be negotiated on or with students. We would expect a parent/carer to collect the phone.

ATTENDANCE & PUNCTUALITY

We expect you to maintain an attendance record of 97% or higher at school. This will ensure you are in the best position to fulfil your potential. If, however, you are ill or unable to attend, or you will be late to school for any reason, then your parent/carer must telephone the school by 8.15am, pressing 1 for the student absence line. You **must** provide a note written by your parent/carer explaining why you were absent on the first morning of your return to school. For appointments during the day evidence will be required. In order that you do not fall behind others in your class, you will be expected to catch up on work you have missed during your absence.

Positive Behaviour Points

At Halewood Academy, we believe in recognising and celebrating positive behaviour. Staff award **Positive Behaviour Points** through **Arbor** when students demonstrate our core values, show excellent conduct, make a positive contribution to school life, or achieve key milestones within the **Graduation programme** throughout **Key Stage 3**.

Students who consistently receive **Positive Behaviour Points** are recognised and celebrated through our **Graduation system**, celebration events and recognition assemblies. Parents and carers are also regularly informed of their child's achievements, ensuring that success is celebrated both at school and at home.

Postcards, Letters and Certificates

Your teachers and support staff will give out postcards, letters and certificates based on your work and effort in lessons and your conduct and involvement around our school.

Assembly

Students are regularly recognised for their endeavours and achievement through virtual assembly and the main assembly for all aspects of school life including Attendance, AtL, Readiness to Learning and engagement with school activities.

Halewood Academy is committed to providing students with experiences beyond the curriculum to support their personal development and growth of cultural understanding.

Trips will also be included for rewards at key points during the school year for students who demonstrate the expectations, core values and uphold the school mission. Previous whole school trips have included theme parks, ice skating, cinema visits and ten pin bowling.

There are also experiences and trips linked with curriculum subjects which can also be international.

From the moment students join in Year 7, they become part of a dynamic and supportive academy community that encourages personal growth, high standards, and a passion for learning.

Year 7, 8 & 9 - The Graduation Programme

All students in Years 7, 8 & 9 are automatically enrolled in the **Graduation Programme**, a Key Stage 3 initiative that recognises and celebrates student achievement and progress. The programme is designed to support academic success and personal development through:

- Maintaining excellent attendance and behaviour
- Actively participating in extra-curricular clubs
- Developing strong attitudes to learning across subjects
- Showing consistent punctuality
- High levels of homework completion

Students who meet the minimum expectations will graduate at the end of each year with a special graduation ceremony. Those who go above and beyond may even graduate with honours, showcasing their commitment to excellence across all six half terms.

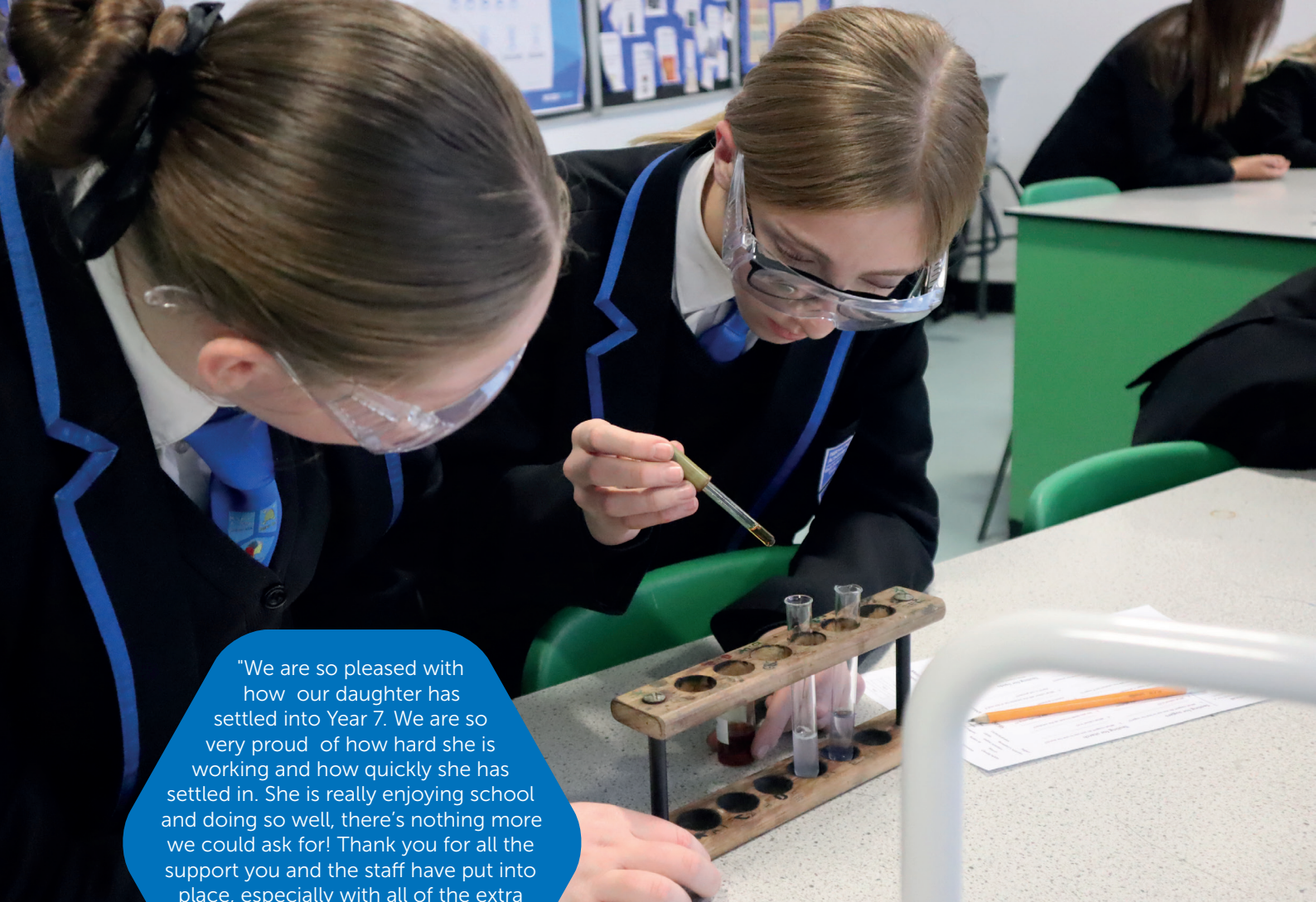
CURRICULUM

DINING ARRANGEMENTS

The school is open in the morning for breakfast from 8.00am to 8.30am.

Our students remain on the school premises during break time and lunch time.

At break time, students are able to purchase a variety of items such as toast, bacon/sausage barm, breakfast wraps and a selection of fruit.

There are a wide range of choices that you can have at lunch time:

- **A packed lunch from home**
- **Sandwiches, wraps and baguettes**
- **Pasta pots (hot or cold)**
- **A variety of hot meals with a different offering each day**

We operate a cashless system at Halewood Academy where parents/ carers can pre-load money onto their accounts through ParentPay. Students then use their finger print or unique code to purchase food.



STRETCH & CHALLENGE

Our results also demonstrate that we know how to stretch and challenge students so that they reach their potential and achieve the best possible outcomes. We saw a significant improvement in 2025 in the number of students achieving the top grades in both GCSE and vocational qualifications.

Our curriculum is designed to ensure that all students receive challenge which allows them to develop skills of analysis, evaluation and deep thinking, at all points in their school career. Not only does this ensure that students can achieve at the highest level within their GCSEs, it also creates a solid foundation for future studies and employment.

Results day at Halewood Academy celebrated another year of significant improvement in outcomes for our hard-working students.

The morning started with the usual nervous anticipation of staff and pupils alike and as results were collected, emotions turned to well-deserved celebration for many. Students had much to be proud of due to their positive application to their studies, determination during revision sessions and resilience during the examinations themselves.

Overall, a greater proportion of students achieved both **English** and **Maths** at grades **9-7, 9-5** and **9-4**, **Science** and **Spanish** results improved and **Geography** and **History** maintained their previous positive outcomes.

Many option subjects continue to perform very well and the vast majority of subjects improved outcomes at all grade boundaries. Most significant improvements were celebrated in **GCSE Physical Education, Sports Science, Computer Science, Music, Religious Education, 3D Art and Design and Photography**. **Drama, Performing Arts and Child Development & Care** continue to perform very strongly.
