SCHOOL UNIFORM

- Black blazer with blue trim and Academy badge
- Black trousers or blue/black tartan skirt
- White shirt
- School tie
- Black V-neck Jumper (optional)
- Plain, black, polishable shoes (no boots/trainers)
- Black socks with trousers or white knee high socks (no bows) /navy tights with skirt

Students must also attend school with a sensible hair style, which is not extreme or which includes unnatural bright colouring or outrageous hair patterns. Hair bands if worn, must be simple and plain.

Jewellery is not allowed with the exception of a wrist watch.

Boys

No other jewellery or piercings are allowed. Students should be well presented at all times, with shirts tucked in to their trousers and skirts.

No badges are to be worn other than those issued by the school, or one charity badge.




SCHOOL UNIFORM

All students are expected to bring a back pack, large enough for exercise books and PE kit, to school every day.

All pupils need a suitable sized school back pack enough to fit A4 folders in.

Please also note the following;

Hoodies are not acceptable on the school premises.

Hair - A pupil's haircut is a very important part of their overall presentation. The Academy will not accept extreme haircuts. Pupils are not allowed to have extreme hair colours; colour change should appear natural. The Academy reserves the right to internally exclude pupils with an extreme hairstyle. Shoulder length hair should be tied back for all practical lessons. Hair bands should be plain in their appearance. Hair accessories must be only plain white, navy blue or black in colour.

Make up - Make up, false eyelashes and nail varnish are not permitted. Pupils who wear make-up, false eyelashes and nail varnish will be asked to remove it. Pupils failing to do so when asked will face appropriate sanctions.

Jewellery - Pupils may wear a wristwatch. They may also wear a cross or other symbol of faith for religious reasons but it may not be visible. Pupils with medical conditions can wear an identity tag. No badges are to be worn other than those issued by the Academy and one charity badge. Any inappropriate jewellery will be confiscated and placed in the Academy's safe. The Academy cannot accept responsibility for the safe keeping of jewellery. All jewellery must be removed for Physical Education.

Piercings - Pupils are not permitted to wear any form of facial or body piercing (including ears). Pupils who persistently violate these rules will be internally excluded. Earrings and other piercings covered by plasters are also not acceptable.

PE KIT

Students will need a school PE T-Shirt with Halewood Academy badge. There is a long sleeved over top which is recommended but not compulsory. Students are required to wear either plain black shorts, tracksuit bottoms or leggings. Parents do not have to purchase all of the items below. Students are expected to bring appropriate footwear to all PE lessons to enable them to engage fully with learning. Students require a clean pair of trainers suitable for indoor and outdoor lessons.

At times during the year, students will undertake PE outside. If students have studded boots suitable for use on grass or our 3G surface, then these are encouraged for outdoor PE lessons as an alternative to trainers.

Students have the option to wear base layers underneath their PE kit, particularly during cold weather. We request that students choose navy blue or black garments that complement our school uniform.






- Halewood T-shirt (compulsory)

ATTENDANCE & PUNCTUALITY

We expect you to maintain an attendance record of 97% or higher at school. This will ensure you are in the best position to fulfil your potential. If, however, you are ill or unable to attend, or you will be late to school for any reason, then your parent/carer must telephone the school by 8.15am, pressing 1 for the student absence line. You must provide a note written by your parent/carer explaining why you were absent on the first morning of your return to school. For appointments during the day evidence will be required.

In order that you do not fall behind others in your class, you will be expected to catch up on work you have missed during your absence.

AJOURNEY OF GROWTH AND ACHIEVEMENT

From the moment students join in Year 7, they become part of a dynamic and supportive academy community that encourages personal growth, high standards, and a passion for learning. Through our structured Graduation Programme and the Halewood Challenge, we provide students with meaningful opportunities to develop essential life skills, build confidence, and prepare for future success.

Phase 1: Year 7 & 8

- The Graduation Programme

All students in Years 7 and 8 are automatically enrolled in the Graduation Programme, a two-year initiative that recognises and celebrates student achievement and progress. The programme is designed to support academic success and personal development through:

- Maintaining excellent attendance and behaviour
- Actively participating in extracurricular clubs
- Developing strong attitudes to learning across subjects
- Engaging in public speaking or showcasing employability skills
- Meeting personalised academic targets in areas like recall and knowledge retention

Students who meet the minimum expectations will graduate at the end of Year 7 and Year 8 in a special cap-and-gown ceremony. Those who go above and beyond may even graduate with honours, showcasing their commitment to excellence in academics, the arts, sports, and community involvement.

Year 9 - The Halewood Challenge

In Year 9, students move on to the Halewood Challenge - an exciting and diverse set of enrichment activities designed to encourage independence, resilience, and a thirst for new experiences. Challenges span five key areas:

- STEAM (Science, Technology, Arts, Engineering and Maths)
- Aspirations
- Careers
- Leadership and Performance
- Or school and wider community

The Halewood Challenge is also structured to align with the Duke of Edinburgh's Bronze Award, giving students a head start toward this prestigious national recognition.

Students track their progress by completing tasks both in school and independently. Completion of various challenges leads to Bronze, Silver, or Gold Halewood Challenge Awards, respectively which will take place within a prestigious awards ceremony at the end of Year 9. Together, the Graduation Programme and Halewood Challenge form a powerful foundation that nurtures ambition, promotes holistic development, and equips students with the skills and experiences they need for success throughout their school journey and beyond.


CURRICULUM

Each year, we assemble a team of Prefects in school: Year 11 students who are appointed as role-models because they represent everything we ask for in a Halewood Academy student.

They are hardworking, motivated and keen to ensure everyone enjoys our school as much as they do. If you are unsure of something or need assistance ask anyone with a red tie and they will help you. Maybe when you are in Year 11 you could be a prefect!



DINING ARRANGEMENTS

The school is open in the morning for breakfast from 8.00am to 8.30am.

Our students remain on the school premises during break time and lunch time.

At break time, students are able to purchase a variety of items such as toast, bacon/sausage barms, breakfast wraps and a selection of fruit.

There are a wide range of choices that you can have at lunch time:

- A packed lunch from home
- Sandwiches, wraps and baguettes
- Pasta pots (hot or cold)
- A variety of hot meals with a different offering each day

We operate a cashless system at **Halewood Academy** where students pre-load money onto their accounts through ParentPay or designated machines. Students then use their finger print or unique code to purchase food.



STRETCH & **CHALLENGE**

Our results also demonstrate that we know how to stretch and challenge students so that they reach their potential and achieve the best possible outcomes. 2024 saw a significant improvement in the number of students achieving the top grades in both GCSE and vocational qualifications.
